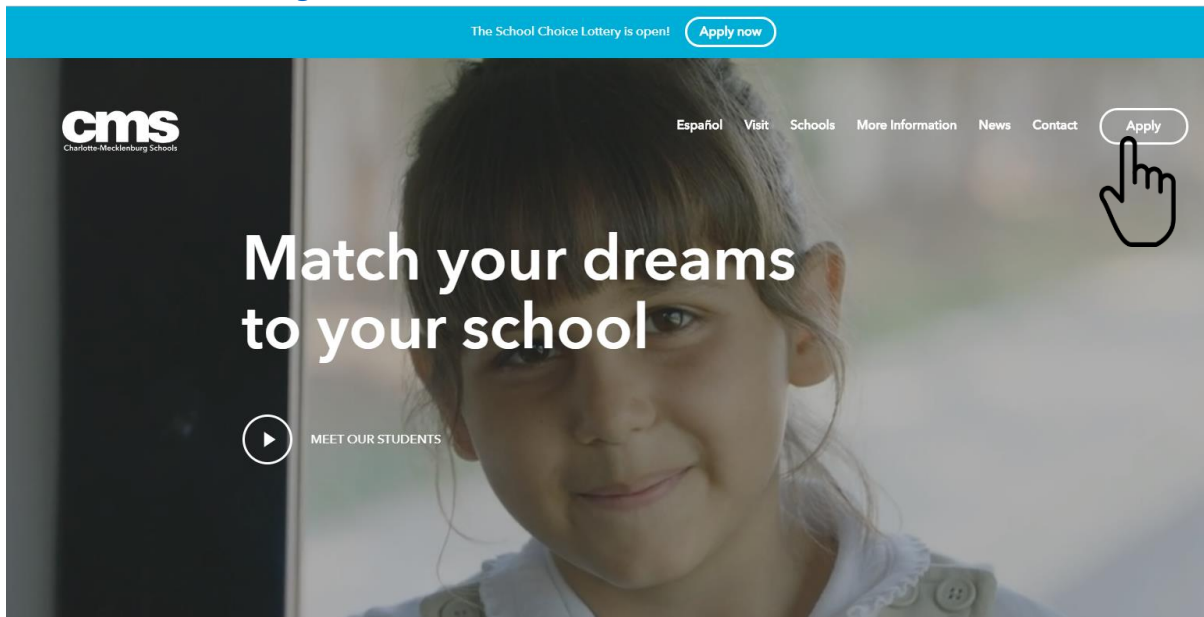

Before registering your options, **please note:** You are required to read and agree to the following school options compact.
International Baccalaureate (grades 9-12) – Students entering middle or high school must be promoted at the end of the school year in which the application is made. Students entering grades 6, 7, 8, 9 and 10 must score at or above Level III in Reading, based on 2015-2016 CMS Administered North Carolina EOG/EOC results. In order to enter the IB Program in grade 11, a student must meet the following prerequisites: English I; English II; Math II or Geometry; Math III or Algebra II; Earth/Environmental Science and/or Biology; Chemistry and/or Physics; World History; Civics and Economics; and Level III of a World Language (e.g., French, German, Latin or Spanish). Students entering in grade 11 must apply via the Special Application Procedures and the Request for Reassignment process including a transcript analysis completed by the prospective school. Only students currently enrolled in an IB Diploma Program will be accepted into grade 12.

Montessori (grades 2-8) – A late entry option for grades 2 and above is available via the Special Application Procedures and the Request for Reassignment Process for students with previous Montessori experience and/or students who successfully complete the late entry interview assessment at the school. In order to gain the greatest benefit, families should commit to their child attending through the terminal grade. Current CMS Montessori students have an automatic magnet continuation from elementary to secondary.

Northwest School of the Arts (grades 6-12) – Students entering grades 6-12, including current fifth grade Visual and Performing Arts magnet students and current eighth grade NWSA students, must submit a NWSA audition application and participate in a successful audition or portfolio assessment prior to the end of the lottery application period. Late auditions will be conducted after this date on a space-available basis, and these students will become part of the established wait pool. STEM: Science, Technology, Engineering and Math (grades 11-12) – Students entering in grades 11 and 12 must apply via the Special Application Procedure and the Request for Reassignment process including a transcript analysis completed by the prospective school.

Talent Development (grades 3-5) – Students entering grades 3-5 must be identified as AIG math and/or AIG reading certified. Families seeking more

Self Reporting

CMS values diversity, and believes all students benefit from learning alongside classmates from a variety of backgrounds and communities. Beginning in the school year, seats in school options and magnet schools will be assigned to achieve the greatest socioeconomic diversity possible.

This means each student entering the lottery will automatically be assigned a priority for available seats based on several factors that contribute to socioeconomically diverse schools. To more accurately assign a seat priority to each student's application, CMS will use a combination of publicly available Census data and self-reported family data.
